

## Publication of the proceedings of 9th ICP

After the meeting, "Proceedings of 9th International Colloquium on Paratuberculosis" will be published.

**Deadline for submission of your paper is December 1, 2007.**

Your paper should be submitted in Open Journals System at:

Instructions for preparing your manuscript are as follows:

Papers should be prepared in Microsoft Word:

- Paper size: A4
- Margins: 2.5 cm
- Single line spacing
- Title: Arial, size 12, bold
- Subheadings, fonts
  - 1st: Capital letters, Arial, size 11, bold
  - 2nd: First letter capital, Arial, size 11, underlined, italics
- Main text: Font: Arial, size 11
- Maximum 4 pages, including figures, tables and references. Text beyond 4 pages will be deleted
- Up to 10 references can be included using the following format:  
Nielsen SS, Some-Body YN, Somebody-Else NY, 2010. Quoquoloo saxmosis – the greatest discovery of a long time. J. Irreprod. Res, 5, 22-37. {1st line not indented, others are; Journal-names abbreviated according to the standard abbreviations ([ftp://ftp.ncbi.nih.gov/pubmed/J\\_Medline.txt](ftp://ftp.ncbi.nih.gov/pubmed/J_Medline.txt))}
- Abstract is optional. If an abstract is included, no more than 250 words are allowed
- Language: Only papers written in English are acceptable. Please ask colleagues for assistance on clarity of the paper, as no editing of the paper will be performed.
- SI units should be used.

### Copyrights:

Please be reminded as you prepare your manuscript for the Colloquium that if your research has previously been or is in the process of being published in journal, you must review that journal's copyright rules. When your article was accepted by the journal, you transferred exclusive copyrights to it. Many journals permit re-publication in a work such as the ICP Proceedings subject to the express condition that the article appears with the following lawful notice on the first page of the Article: "This article appeared in the [date] edition of [Journal name]. © [Year] [Publisher name]. All rights reserved." The copyright rules vary by journal however. It is not the responsibility of individuals organizing the Colloquium or producing the Proceedings to ensure that copyright rules are followed. It is your responsibility as author to investigate the copyright rules pertaining to your publications.

### Editorial process:

Papers are included as they are submitted. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the authors to ascertain that scientific quality meets standards of peer-reviewed journals. The authors are also responsible for the language in the paper, and we encourage you to have an English speaking colleague to check the language of the paper prior to submission.
